Take a walking tour with a park ranger through the original settlement along the scenic James River, and even "meet" a 17th-century personality.
- Historic Yorktown* A revolutionary riverfront treasure. Take some time at leisure to discover this quaint historic town at your own pace. Enjoy strolling th quaint streets and riding the free trolley. The sounds and precision marching of *The Fifes and Drums of York Town* set the stage with patriotic music complementing the other historical attractions.
- Busch Gardens Williamsburg Ride world-class roller coasters at Busch Gardens, European-themed Park with 350 acres of fun rides, children's attractions, animal shows and live entertainment.

- Yorktown Battlefield & Visitor Center Before the cannon fire on the battlefields and the forming of a new nation, there was Yorktown. See where American Independence won its freedom during the American Revolutionary War. Tour of this national park includes the battlefield earthworks, Washington's Headquarters, Washington's tent and Surrender Field. The Visitor center is a living history museum of the American Revolution.

- Water Country USA Get ready for a wave of adventure! As the mid-Atlantic's largest water park, Water Country USA offers 43 acres of pools, lazy rivers and water rides.
